Sledders can bring their own plastic sleds or rent or purchase a sled from one of three stores conveniently located within walking distance of the hill. For safety and supervision, parents can ride with smaller children.

Trails wind through frosty woodlands and open up to views of snow-capped peaks and valleys blanketed in white, creating a picturesque backdrop.
